

World Knowledge and Understanding

History:

- The Black Death
- Great Fire of London
- The Gunpowder Plot

Geography

- Compare and contrast the village of Y Ffôr with the city of London.

Religious Education

- Moses and the Plagues of Egypt
- Hinduism - the story of Rama and Sita, and the festival of light.

Science

- Light and sound - sources and properties.
- Changing materials by heat e.g. ice and chocolate.

Mathematics

- Sort London bus numbers into Hundreds, Tens and Units.
- Sort London bus numbers from the lowest to the highest .
- Recognize 2D shapes in buildings and build 3D models.
- Read London train timetables.

Language, Literacy and Communication

- Role play - travelling on the train, in a taxi, on the Underground.
- Discuss London's main attractions and characteristics developing the use of correct syntax and a growing vocabulary.
- Read a variety of texts describing The Plague and The Great Fire.
- Dick Whittington and His Cat - role play, leading to re-writing parts of the story in their own words and imagining a different ending.
- Create a poster warning of the Black Death's signs and symptoms.
- Compose a monologue describing a child's experience of The Great Fire of London.
- Compose a poem about 'Fire' using vivid and original language.

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Personal and Social Development

- Circle Time - develop the children's looking, listening, thinking and concentration skills.
- Growth Mindset - develop the children's resilience and positive outlook towards their schoolwork.
- People who help us - firefighters, doctors, nurses etc.

Creative Skills

- Develop drawing skills by observing photos of famous London landmarks.
- Hindu Art - study and create Rangoli patterns and Divas.
- Compose and perform 'The Dance of the Flames'.
- Listen to and appreciate the musical elements of 'The Four Seasons' by Vivaldi.
- Learn to perform an array of songs with control of the voice and breath.
